*Online procedure: You may pay for your tickets and accomplish your ICP membership as follows: (1) Download the ICP membership form from the ICP website (www.icp.org.ph). (2) Deposit the payment for tickets (P1,350 per inductee and P900 per guest) at any BPI branch to the ICP account (BPI Loyola-Katipunan branch, account No. 3081-0830-95). (3) Scan the deposit slip. (4) Email the deposit slip together with your accomplished ICP membership form and ID photo to: info@icp.org.ph. The ICP receipt will be issued to you during the oath taking ceremony. Deadline for payment and registration is October 14, 2011.
